In 1954, His Excellency Jawaharlal Nehru wanted the French Institute of Pondicherry to be "an open window on France". Almost 50 years after, the arrival of a new director to head the French Institute of Pondicherry and the organisation of a workshop in Delhi to appraise the Indo-French scientific cooperation and its perspectives, is a unique opportunity to raise the question of the role the Institute should play towards Indo-French cooperation: a French Institute in India, for what and for whom?

Firstly, one must define the correct scientific role that the Institute can play. Doubtlessly, from this point of view the Institute, which promotes research projects in Indology, Ecology and Social Sciences, is at the heart of the challenge of sustainable development, India being particularly relevant for carrying out research in this domain. But the challenge for the Institute is to be clear and visible with limited means. FIP has to thus make sure to focus these means on some collective projects of quality, relevant in comparison to the experience and competences it assembles, and which are likely to assure an influence in India as well as in the rest of the world. A "project culture" needs to be introduced at the Institute.

Second, FIP must be embedded in the national and the international network of research and is to be considered both as a "meeting point" and a "melting pot" for scientific communities involved in the fields mentioned above. To give a new life to the FIP, it is necessary to consider that the Institute is intended to receive and implement, partly or entirely, collaborative scientific projects between on one hand, Indian laboratories, and beyond, South and South East Asian laboratories, and on the other hand, French laboratories, and beyond, European laboratories. The future of the Institute rests partly on its capacity to hold on to the solid ties with the scientific community of France, India and Europe.

I have already taken certain decisions which would allow an active participation of the Institute in the global and scientific dynamics, which can be described in three key words: excellence, partnership and openness. Besides, I hope that the major French and Indian research institutions and universities will take advantage of this beautiful instrument to undertake together ambitious collaborative scientific projects on the challenges concerning sustainable development, and to which India gives a very special significance.

Environment and climate change have become very important issues globally. With a representative from India heading up the IPCC (Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change) since 2002 and the organisation of the COP-8 (Conference of Parties to the UNFCC) meeting at New Delhi in November 2002, these concerns have been highlighted regularly even in the popular press. With a long tradition in specialised research to understand the evolution of the physical environment in India in a holistic manner through a multidisciplinary approach combining palynology, ecology, cartography and GIS, the French Institute of Pondicherry played host to an important International meeting - the IGBP-PAGES (International Geosphere Biosphere Programme's - Past Global Changes) Workshop cum Training programme on "Late Quaternary Environmental Change - Emerging Issues" (10th - 15th Feb). With earth sciences transcending strict disciplinary barriers, there is immense scope for frontline, state of the art research with a clear human dimension in this field. The meeting was instrumental in bringing together an optimal mix of both young and established global change scientists with diverse specialisations and an interest in the South Asian region. This International meet, planned in tandem with another important national workshop and training course organised by the Anna University from 3rd February, with a Common Seminar on 8th Feb co-organised by the French Institute succeeded in optimising resources and increasing the outreach of the PAGES science to a wide cross-section of earth system scientists and researchers, particularly young scientists, who availed the benefits of both training programmes. In addition, there was another milestone in science communication, with a series of public events in Pondicherry (www.ifpindia.org) as part of the almost month long focus on this issue.

Political and Social Dynamics of Tibetan Medicine in Ladakh

The transformations of 'traditional' medical systems are inevitably embedded in a complex network of factors, which extend far beyond the bounds of what might be widely considered as the field of 'health'. This fundamental anthropological view is applied to, and further elaborated in, the context of Ladakh, a remote region of northwestern Indian Himalayas, so as to know how healers (here, amchi, or practitioners of Tibetan medicine) and their institutions cope with, and transform modernity in a rapidly changing society. This research is integrated in a transversal project of the IFP, which bridges social sciences and ecology. It addresses a variety of political, social, cultural and environmental issues, ranging from the local to the international level. That is, this work does not only reveal the own dynamic of the amchi medical system in Ladakh but also the entire context in which it happens to be. This research explores selected ports of entry, which aim to understand the strategic and adaptative mechanisms of the Ladakhi amchi's community: e.g. professionalisation, legitimation, legal recognition and intellectual property rights (IPRs). It aims to understand the contemporary social and political construction of this medical system.

The seminar, entitled 'Women's Quotas in Urban Local Government: A Cross-national Comparison', consisted of a confrontation of the main findings of the CSH-ISS study with those of similar studies conducted not only in other Indian cities (Ahmedabad, Jaipur, Bangalore, Kolhapur, Rohtak) but also in countries such as Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Germany, Belgium and France.

A seminar "Meeting on Micro - Finance - What means and ways for micro-finance and what impacts?" was held from 9th - 10th Jan by the Dept of Social Sciences under the micro-finance programme coordinated by J.-M. SERVET, Research Director at IRD/IFP with more than 50 participants. The following seminars on micro-finance have been planned: on empowerment and on gender in July and Dec, respectively.

A photographic exhibition on the "Forms of Siva" was organised by the photo archives of the IFP at the Alliance Française, Bangalore from 22nd Jan - 8th Feb. The exhibition was inaugurated and a presentation on "Siva: History and Development" was made by Prof. S.P. NARANG, HoD, Indology.

International PAGES workshop, EILQUEC & POLTRAIN 2003 was held by the IFP from 10th-15th Feb. His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor of Pondicherry Mr. K.R. MALKANI inaugurated the programme. Scientists and students from seven countries, several premier Indian institutions such as Physical Research laboratory (PRL), Ahmedabad, Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM), Pune

and Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), Bangalore, participated. The Dept. of Science and Technology (DST) & ISRO-GBP (Geosphere Biosphere Programme), the French and German Embassies in India supported the workshop. As a precursor to this event and as part of the Saison de la France, a series of public events, titled Climate: An Introduction (1st – 21st Feb) were organised by IFP and Alliance Française de Pondicherry to generate awareness about climate and environment changes for school students and the public with financial support from the French Embassy in India. The first 'Working Group of Indology and Social Sciences on Contemporary Tamil History and Language' met on 15th Feb.

"Identity and Territory in India", the Young Researchers Workshop in Social Sciences, coordinated by Rémy DELAGE and Zoé E. HEADLEY, University of Bordeaux III and EHESS, was organised by the AJEI and the University of Calcutta, in collaboration with MSH (Paris), IFP (Pondicherry), CSH (New Delhi), from 17th - 21th Feb at the Dept of History, University of Calcutta. The first "Classical Tamil Winter School", organised by Charlotte SCHMID (EFEO) and Eva WILDEN (University of Hamburg), was held by the Pondicherry Centre of the Eçole Française d'Extrême Orient (EFEO), from 20th Jan -15th Feb.

Participants came from Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, Japan and Russia, all with at least a basic knowledge of modern or ancient forms of the language, to study classical Tamil in Pondicherry. Students were able to benefit from a range of different approaches to the literature: Sascha EBELING (University of Cologne) and Eva WILDEN (University of Hamburg) gave classes on the grammar, concentrating on the morphology and the earliest poetry; VIJAYAVENUGOPAL (EFEO) gave courses on Tamil inscriptions, concentrating particularly on inscriptions of the Chola period in Pondicherry territory: V. Varada DESIKAN (EFEO) introduced the participants to the poetry of the Alvars and the Ramayana of Kamban; and T.V. GOPAL IYER expounded a wide selection of Cankam literature. A. MURUGAIYAN (Ecole Pratique des Hautes Etudes, Paris) gave classes about 'hero-stone' inscriptions. We hope that the Classical Tamil Winter School will become a regular fixture for encounters, as yet all too rare, of enthusiastic scholars and students of classical Tamil.

Aside from the regular classes, archaeological sites in the vicinity were visited (partly for the study of inscriptions in situ) and six lectures were given: Dr. Y. SUBBARAYALU (Thanjavur University) gave a lecture about Tamil epigraphical data and the project of mapping the Tamil Nadu of medieval times, a project being developed in collaboration with the French Institute of Pondicherry (22nd Jan); Dr. Charlotte SCHMID (EFEO) gave a lecture on the distribution of the image of Krishna playing the flute (23rd Jan); Dr. A. MURUGAIYAN (EPHE, Paris) lectured about hero-stones in Tamil Nadu and Karnataka (2nd Feb); Emmanuel FRANCIS (University of Louvain, Belgium) presented a new chronology for the Pallava site of Mahabalipuram (7th Feb); Dr. Daud ALI (School of Oriental and African Studies, London) spoke on the battle poem Kalinkattupparani (12th Feb); and Dr. Eva WILDEN (University of Hamburg, Germany) spoke of the urgent need for critical editions of classical Tamil texts (14th Feb).


