The recent evolution of the Centre de Sciences Humaines has reinforced its role as an observer of the political, economic and social transformations of contemporary India and South Asia. As the new director of the CSH, I intend to consolidate this mission on the basis of research poles that have established the reputation and excellence of the centre. Thus, our focus is to question India as an emerging power on the international scene, and to analyse the transition processes that affect the South Asian region.

While studies in international relations presently focuses on India's foreign policy issues, a new programme is going to be launched on technology transfers and the role of the Indian diaspora, another issue that has lately attracted the attention of the Indian Government.

In the field of political sciences, the main themes remain the impact of decentralisation policy as well as electoral representation and identity politics. Nevertheless, a new study has been initiated on the dynamics between NGOs and social movements in India, against the backdrop of the World Social Forum.

The economic research pole has acquired expertise in assessing the impact of economic reforms, especially on the infrastructure and service sectors. India and the World Trade Organisation is another important focus, and more recently the issue of economic inequalities and social capital.

Lastly, research on urban dynamics will gain momentum, with new programmes on urban fringe development as well as urban governance.

Obviously, the role of the CSH as a research centre on India and South Asia could not be envisaged without a large network of institutional contacts and partnerships at different levels: in India and beyond in South Asia, in France and beyond in Europe. **Dr. Véronique Dupont**

The French Institute has proposed with its partners, CIRAD, University of Wageningen, The Rice Wheat Consortium for Indo Gangetic Plains, a project called OSCAR (see http://www.oscarasia.org) which has been granted by the ASIA IT&C Office of the European Commission (A Contribution of 200.000 Euros for this Get-in-Touch Keep-in-Touch project). This project aims to initiate cooperation between European and South Asian institutions for bringing IT&C to rural areas. This is done by helping to address the issue of declining agricultural productivity in South Asia by proposing a tool for decision-making in weed identification and control. This decision-making tool will target farmers of the Indo-Gangetic Plains (IGP) at the village level and will effectively address the issues of local language by taking into account the cultural diversity of the populations of the targeted area. An existing software for species identification (IDAO) will be adapted to run on a low-cost computing device (a Personal Digital Assistant (PDA), working with Linux – An Open Source Operating System) that can be shared among farmers of a local community. A model database for identification and control of a set of the most important weeds of the IGP will be developed for integration with the species identification software.

Perception of the tool by farmers will also be assessed in order to improve the tool's usage and appropriateness at farmer community level. Finally, at the end of 30 months, this project in its final workshop will formulate recommendations and formats for similar decision-making tools, in addition to a small prototype.

"Paniniya-vyakarana-udaharana-kosa" or "The Paninian Grammar through its Examples

Paninian grammar is an imposing and indispensable monument, for Sanskritists, but also for grammarians and linguists. But the difficulties that it presents are many: the compression, mode of expression, and sheer number of the rules, the complexity of the system as a whole, and the necessity of approaching the text through commentaries, which have mostly not been translated (though it is these which furnish the examples).

Only the grammarians, in fact, among the pandits, master this field, which they study over the course of a long traditional apprenticeship. And it is here that the French institutions in Pondicherry, with its staff of lettrés provide a priceless asset.

In light of these facts, the present programme aims to show in detail (a) the range of application of this grammar, and (b) the functioning of its system, and in doing so to preserve traditional learning while transmitting it in a new and "modern" form: an electronic dictionary, whose main entries are the examples

A series of 9 volumes is being prepared, preceded by a volume presenting the complete body of examples.

This programme is a collaboration between the EFEO, the IFP, and the Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha of Tirupati.

Social Capital, redistribution and development: an Indian case study

The goal of this research is to perform a macroeconomic analysis of the caste system while addressing the impact of caste on inequalities and economic performance. The first part of the research analyses the redistribution dimension of social capital. Trying to construct a social capital indicator by collecting some information on caste associations at the state level in India, we will analyse the link between the social capital variable and the level of consumption inequalities between non SC (Scheduled Caste) and SC. The second part will involve a fieldwork analysis describing how the caste membership is still prevailing in the formation of networks between entrepreneurs in West Bengal.
